Who can apply?

You can apply if you are a:

- Registered Charity
- Voluntary and community organisation
- Club
- Friends Association

You cannot apply if you are a:

- An individual
- Statutory or public sector organisation i.e. Schools, Hospitals, Councils such as parish, town or district
- Groups who aims are not for people i.e. animals, plants
- Regional offices or National bodies if not independent



You can apply if...

You have:

- Constitution/Set of Rules
- A copy of your most recent accounts
- A UK bank account in the name of your organisation with at least two unrelated signatories
- A current turnover/income that does not exceed £30,000 per annum (averaged over 3 years)
- An independent referee to support your organisation
- Child Protection Policy/Safeguarding Adults Policy



How much can you apply for?

- £250 and £5,000
- £5,000 is the maximum grant
- Only one application can be considered at a time
- One Grassroots Grants funded project needs to be completed and the End of Grant report approved before you can apply again



Sport Relief - Who can apply?

You can apply if you are a:

- Community Groups
- Resident Associations
- Social Enterprises/Community Interest
- Credit Unions

Sorry but this fund cannot help:

- An individual
- Statutory or public sector organisation i.e. Schools, Hospitals, Councils such as parish, town or district
- Trips abroad
- Buses or other community transport schemes (not including transport costs forming part of your project)
- Building costs



You can apply if...

You have:

- Constitution/Set of Rules
- A copy of your most recent accounts
- A UK bank account in the name of your organisation with at least two unrelated signatories
- An independent referee to support your organisation
- Child Protection Policy/Safeguarding Adults Policy



Criteria

- Increase access to sport and exercise for people who face social exclusion and isolation
- Help people who are experiencing difficulties in their lives
- Increasing local services
- Building skills of local people
- Increase community cohesion
- Respond to local economic needs



How much can you apply for?

- £1,000 and £10,000 although the average grant is £2,500.00
- £10,000 is the maximum grant
- Only one application can be considered at a time
- Cornwall only receives £15,645.00 of Sport Relief grant monies per year which is divided between two panel meetings (£7,822.50 available at each panel meeting)
